In the prologue, Klinenberg presents initial information about the July 1995 heat wave that struck Chicago, killing hundreds of the city's residents. He argues that hot weather by itself does not explain why so many Chicagoans died that summer and goes on to tell us he will present the results of his social autopsy of the deaths.

In Heat Wave: A Social Autopsy of Disaster in Chicago (University of Chicago Press), Klinenberg has looked at the week-long heat wave of July 1995, which killed over 700 people.
