

# Key Distribution Guidelines

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There are various combinations by which a key can be selected for A and B:- A key can be selected by A and physically delivered to B, A third party can select the key and physically deliver the key to A and B, If A and B have previously and recently used a key, one party can transmit to the other the new key, which has been encrypted by using the old key, and If A and B each has an encrypted connection to a third party C, C can deliver a key ...

Distribution of Public Keys Several techniques have been proposed for the distribution of public keys. They can be grouped into the following public announcement, publicly available directory, public-key authority, and public-key certificates. The point of public-key encryption is that the public key is public.
