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According to ANCC, the requirements for the psychiatric-mental health nursing RN-BC credential include an RN license, 2 years of practice as a full-time registered nurse, 2,000 hours minimum of clinical practice in psychiatric-mental health nursing within 3 years, and 30 hours of continuing education in psychiatric-mental health nursing within 3 years.

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
