care facility or nursing home. The goal of infection control procedures is to prevent transmission of infectious agents to residents and healthcare workers. These procedures traditionally have been referred to as isolation techniques.

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A Long Term Care resident is entitled to 2 (two) casual days per week. A week constitutes from Sunday to Saturday. 2) Medical Leave of Absence. Medical Leave covers a period for up to 30 days.

Nursing Homes are long-term residential care settings that provide a range of services to residents who have no family support and require assistance with most of their activities of daily living and/or daily nursing care. These nursing home residents are typically unable to be cared for at home by family members, caregivers or service ...
