Teamwork Rubric. This is a two page rubric: side 1 allows the student to reflect on and score his/her participation within a group and side 2 allows the student to reflect on and score the group's ability to work together. It can be used with groups of any size. It is set up as a front-to-back template and there.

Rubric: Each student is evaluated along three dimensions, these having to do respectively with the student's contribution to the project/work, how effectively the student discharged his or her responsibilities as a member of the team, and the quality of his or her interactions with the other team ...
