23/11/2020 · Summarizing means giving a concise overview of a text’s main points in your own words. A summary is always much shorter than the original text. Writing a summary does not involve critiquing or analyzing the source—you should simply provide a clear, objective, accurate account of the most important information and ideas, without copying any text from the original and without missing any of ...

Summarizing a Paragraph A summary is a short retelling of a longer written passage, containing the author’s most important ideas. Summarizing helps improve both your reading and writing skills. To summarize, you must read a passage closely, finding the main ideas and supporting ideas.

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How to Summarize a Paragraph 1. Preview and read. Preview and read the paragraph closely. You probably will find that you need to read the paragraph more than one time. 2. Make a list or outline. Determine the main idea and the supporting details of the paragraph. Make a list or outline of these ideas. Be sure to use your own words. 3. Write a summary.

3/7/2020 · The SAAC method is another useful technique for summarizing any kind of text (such as a story, an article, or a speech). SAAC is an acronym for "State, Assign, Action, Complete." Each word in the acronym refers to a specific element that should be included in the summary. State: the name of the article, book, or story

6/5/2021 · A summary's length depends on the passage you're summarizing. If it's a short article or story, then it should just be one long paragraph. If it's a novel, however, 3 to 5 paragraphs should be enough. So really, it depends on the passage.

Summarizing a text, or distilling its essential concepts into a paragraph or two, is a useful study tool as well as good writing practice. A summary has two aims: (1) to reproduce the overarching ideas in a text, identifying the general concepts that run through the entire piece, and (2) to express these overarching ideas using precise, specific language.
