Important thematic topics in *The Kite Runner* include the price of theft, hubris, the love of child, brothers, the past affecting the present, and the atonement for sins. Some important symbols include kites, a harelip, brothers, and dualities (of life in Afghanistan versus life in the Western World; summer versus winter; lies and truth; and good and evil).

The reader's understanding of global issues connects the novel with the real world, just as the repetition of an action demonstrates the growth of a character. Hiding the money under the mattress is a small but significant gesture: unlike the first time, when Amir was acting cowardly and selfishly, this time he is thinking of others, which is another step on Amir's path of atonement.
